

PE and Sports Premium for Primary Schools Impact Review

2017-18

In 2017-18 Estcourt Primary Academy will receive the fifth year instalment of PE funding. The funding will be used in a variety of ways to further improve and develop teaching and learning across the whole academy. We will encourage pupils to continue to lead healthy lifestyles, enjoy PE and Sport and experience high quality teaching. They will be encouraged to take part in competition and aim for sporting excellence. Throughout 3 of the 5 years we have employed a specialist teacher to work alongside our teachers to develop their skills and knowledge to enhance the quality of the teaching of physical education; as this has improved the quality of learning in P.E., the focus this year is to further develop opportunities for a wider range of sports offered, competing opportunities for our children..

Having already seen impact of the funding from the previous 4 years we expect for this additional funding to have continued and sustained impact on provision of PE and sport within our academy. Learning walks, lesson observations and monitoring by SLT and the PE leader have identified the following areas to address in PE coaching this year: high quality coaching in KS1 and KS2, increased awareness of healthy lifestyles, increased quality of warm ups and agility games to build up stamina. Pupils will also have many opportunities to participate in competitive events in various locations. The academy attained the Gold Sports Mark in July 2017
