Christianity: Inside a church

Pews 	Seats for the worshippers.
Font 	Filled with water used for a baptism.
Stained glass 	Show stories and characters from the bible.
Pulpit 	Platform that the vicar speaks from.
altar 	A place to offer gifts to God.
Cross 	To remind worshippers of the crucifixion of Jesus.

Islam: Inside a mosque

Prayer hall 	A large hall used for worship. There are no seats as Muslims worship on the floor.
Mihrab 	A room in the mosque that shows the direction of Mecca, and the way Muslims should face when praying.
Minaret 	A tower at the mosque from which Muslims are called to prayer.
Prayer mat 	A small carpet to kneel on when praying.
Wash area 	A place for Muslims to wash before they pray.
Minbar 	A platform where the Imam stands in the mosque.

church	A place of worship for people of Christian faith.

vicar	Somebody who looks after the church and leads services and ceremonies.

Muslim	A follow of Islam.
Islam	The religion of Muslims.
Quran	The Muslim holy book.
Imam	The leader of the prayers in a mosque.
